ANNIE STANLEY, ALL AT SEA (MacMillan, 2021)

Annie Stanley is finding it hard to come to terms with her dad's death - maybe because they didn't see eye-to-eye for the final few years of his life. Peter felt Annie should have worked a bit harder at her relationship with her ex-partner Rob. And Annie couldn't forgive Peter for taking up with Bev, a widow, nine months after her own mother's death. Now Annie is left wracked with guilt: why didn't she make things better before it was too late? What can she do about it now? When she learns that Bev intends to scatter Peter's ashes in landlocked Tyrol, where the couple had their last summer holiday, Annie hatches a ludicrous plan. On a visit to Bev's, she furtively helps herself to the urn containing Peter's ashes and does a runner.

But...there is some method in Annie's madness: all his life, Peter had been fascinated by the sea. She is going to take 'him' on a tour of his beloved Shipping Forecast: Dogger, Fisher, German Bight ... Shannon, Rockall, Malin, Hebrides. She doesn't know where these places are, or how you get there, but she and Dad will find them. And when the time and place feel right, she'll scatter him off some salty cliff.
